## **Biblical Mandate for Christian Education**

Why provide a Christian education for our children? The Bible commands it. The Bible is explicit that parents are responsible for their children's education. As teachers it is our job to partner with parents in fulfilling this mandate. Teachers at Grace Academy should become intimately familiar with the following scriptures in order to articulate a clear understanding of this mandate.

### **Selection of Verses Mandating Christian Education**

"Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one! You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

### Deuteronomy 6: 4 - 9

<sup>1</sup> O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!
You have set your glory above the heavens.
<sup>2</sup> Out of the mouth of babies and infants, you have established strength because of your foes, to still the enemy and the avenger.

### Psalm 8:1-2

Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth!
<sup>2</sup> I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old,
<sup>3</sup> things that we have heard and known, that our fathers have told us.
<sup>4</sup> We will not hide them from their children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done.

<sup>5</sup> He established a testimony in Jacob and appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our fathers to teach to their children,
<sup>6</sup> that the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children,
<sup>7</sup> so that they should set their hope in God and not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments;
<sup>8</sup> and that they should not be like their fathers,

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a stubborn and rebellious generation, a generation whose heart was not steadfast, whose spirit was not faithful to God.

<sup>5</sup> Thorns and snares are in the way of the crooked; whoever guards his soul will keep far from them.
<sup>6</sup> Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it.

**You are the salt** of the earth; but if **the salt has lost its flavor**, how shall it be seasoned? It is good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men. **You are the light** of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden.

Matthew 5: 13,14

*Jesus said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God* with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

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### **Examples of Education in Scriptures**

<sup>24</sup> Now a Jew named Apollos, a native of Alexandria, came to Ephesus. He was an eloquent man, competent in the Scriptures. <sup>25</sup> He had been instructed in the way of the Lord. And being fervent in spirit,<sup>[d]</sup> he spoke and taught accurately the things concerning Jesus, though he knew only the baptism of John. <sup>26</sup> He began to speak boldly in the synagogue, but when Priscilla and Aquila heard him, they took him aside and explained to him the way of God more accurately. <sup>27</sup> And when he wished to cross to Achaia, the brothers encouraged him and wrote to the disciples to welcome him. When he arrived, he greatly helped those who through grace had believed, <sup>28</sup> for he powerfully refuted the Jews in public, showing by the Scriptures that the Christ was Jesus.

### Acts 18:24-28

<sup>5</sup> And have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons?

"My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord,

- nor be weary when reproved by him.
- <sup>6</sup> For the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives."

<sup>7</sup> It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline? <sup>8</sup> If you are left without discipline, in which all have participated, then you are illegitimate children and not sons. <sup>9</sup> Besides this, we have had earthly fathers who disciplined us and we respected them. Shall we not much more be subject to the Father of spirits and live? <sup>10</sup> For they disciplined us for a short time as it seemed best to them, but he disciplines us for our good, that we may share his holiness. <sup>11</sup> For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

Hebrews 12:5-11

<sup>10</sup> You, however, have followed my teaching, my conduct, my aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness, <sup>11</sup> my persecutions and sufferings that happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium, and at Lystra—which persecutions I endured; yet from them all the Lord rescued me. <sup>12</sup> Indeed, all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted, <sup>13</sup> while evil people and impostors will go on from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived. <sup>14</sup> But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it <sup>15</sup> and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. <sup>16</sup> All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, <sup>17</sup> that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.
