STEP 2: Essential Questions

- Create questions that are directly related to the Biblical truths.
- Questions help to form a Biblical worldview.














- Essential questions
 - Who created time?

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 - Why is time important
 - How does knowing how to tell time help us serve God and others?

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 - What do the consistent patterns in the solar system say about God's faithfulness and dependability?
