Prayer



Why do we learn to read and write well?


We learn to read and write well because God has created the written word, and He has placed the mystery of salvation in a written story.




And he brought near the clans of Judah, and the clan of the Zerahites was taken. And he brought near the clan of the Zerahites man by man, and Zabdi was taken.


18 And he brought near his household man by man, and Achan the son of Carmi, son of Zabdi, son of Zerah, of the tribe of Judah, was taken.

1 "And the Lord sent Nathan to David. He came to him and said to him, "There were two men in a certain city, the one rich and the other poor."









"You are the man!"




What is history?

We should learn history so we will remember that God will guard, purify, and strengthen us, to




What is science?

We should learn science to rejoice in God's creation and see that the whole earth is full of His glory.




