The effect of elevated language upon an audience is not persuasion but *transport*. At every time and in every way imposing speech, with the spell it throws over us, prevails over that which aims at persuasion and gratification. Our persuasions we can usually control, but the influences of the sublime bring power and irresistible might to bear, and reign supreme over every hearer. Similarly, we see skill in invention, and due order and arrangement of matter, emerging as the hardwon result not of one thing nor of two, but of the whole texture of the composition, whereas Sublimity flashing forth at the right moment scatters everything before it *like a thunderbolt*, and at once displays the power of the orator in all its plenitude. DREAD OF ANTICIPATION: Terror is characterized by "obscurity" or indeterminacy in its treatment of potentially horrible events; it is this indeterminacy that leads the reader toward the sublime.

**PARALYSIS IN PRESENCE: Horror, in contrast, "nearly** annihilates" the reader's responsive capacity with its unambiguous displays of atrocity.

The passion caused by the great and sublime in nature, when those causes operate most powerfully, is **Astonishment**; and astonishment is that state of the soul, in which all its motions are suspended, with some degree of horror. In this case the mind is so entirely filled with its object that it cannot entertain any other, nor by consequence reason on that object which employs it. Hence arises the great power of the sublime, that far from being produced by them, it anticipates our reasonings, and hurries us on by an *irresistible force*. Astonishment, as I have said, is the effect of the sublime in its highest degree; the inferior effects are admiration, reverence and respect.
